Engineering Technician II

Job Description: Performs standardized or prescribed assignments involving a sequence of related operations, follows standard work methods on recurring assignments but receives explicit instructions on unfamiliar assignments. Technical adequacy of routine work is reviewed on completion; non-routine work may be reviewed in progress. This technician performs at this level, one or a combination of such typical duties as:

- a. Following specific instructions, assembles or constructs simple or standard equipment or parts, servicing or repairing simple instruments or equipment;
- b. Conducting a variety of tests using established methods, preparing test specimens, adjusting and operating equipment, recording test data, and pointing out deviations resulting from equipment malfunction or observational errors;
- c. Extracting engineering data from various prescribed but non-standardized sources, processing the data following well-defined methods including elementary algebra and geometry, and presenting the data in prescribed form.

Qualifications: Personnel must reside in Yuma or be willing to relocate to Yuma at own expense. Candidate must be able to work both inside and outside in the desert environment for extended periods (10-12 hours per day). The test activities require day and night shifts and the candidate must be able to work either shift for a normal 6 day work week but periodically there will be 7 day work weeks. Personnel must be able to read, comprehend, write and speak English. Personnel must have a valid driver's license with an insurable driving record. Personnel must have at least a government SECRET clearance or will be subject to a Government security investigation and must be able to achieve being granted an Interim Security clearance within 30 days of employment date.

Physical Demands: Must be able to stand, sit, bend, stoop, crawl, reach with both arms and hands and have good hand eye coordination. Must be able to climb onto the top of military vehicles for some activities. Specific vision ability requires close vision, depth perception and ability to adjust focus. Personnel must be able to lift up to 45 pounds.

Desired Qualifications: Some knowledge of installation, maintenance and operation of tactical radios; knowledge of operation of Blue Force Tracker; knowledge of using spectrum analyzers, oscilloscopes, multimeters and ohmmeters for measurement of RF, VSWR, Desensitization, COSITE and Electric Magnetic Environment (EME); knowledge of signal generators and amplifiers for creating an RF environment and familiarization with MANCAT are definite desired capabilities.
